Born to Build to kick goals with the Adelaide Footy League

The Malinauskas Labor Government is turning to footy players across the state in a bid to encourage construction apprentices as part of a new initiative with Master Builders South Australia and Adelaide Footy League.

Amid the skills crisis across the country, it is estimated there could be 8,000 to 13,000 job openings in SA's construction industry over the next five years, so the work needs to begin now to fill those gaps.

The Minster for Education, Training and Skills, Blair Boyer donned a Modbury Hawks guernsey to announce the \$225,000 funding boost to extend the successful *Born to Build* program at this weekend's Hawks vs Scotch College match.

The Master Builders SA *Born to Build* program promotes a variety of career pathways and options within the building and construction industry and aims to deliver the next generation of tradies.

The construction industry is the third largest industry in the state in terms of employment -8.5 per cent of all employment, and more than 75,000 people - and gross value added of \$8 billion in 2020-21.

Master Builders SA and the Adelaide Footy League will work closely together to further boost the profile and recruitment of construction apprentices in South Australia.

The two organisations will work with clubs, players, members and officials to promote the *Born to Build* program as a great pathway to a long and well-paid career in building and construction. There will also be a focus on encouraging more women and first nations people to join the industry.

All Adelaide Footy League players interested in the industry and apprenticeships will be provided a range of initiatives completely free including:

- White Card training (normally \$140 per person)
- HIVIZ Women Building South Australia mentoring program to support women in the industry
- An on-site try-a-trade program
- Work experience opportunities through the football clubs with *Born to Build* industry ambassadors
